#### Cross-Country Ski and Snowshoe Weekend

Val David, Quebec

March 9 to 12, 2018

The Toronto Bruce Trail Club would like to invite our members to join them for a fabulous cross-country ski and snowshoe weekend in Val David, Quebec. You will travel in a luxury highway coach and depart at 7:00 am from York Mills station. Cost is \$340 + tax per person (based on double occupancy) and includes three nights accommodation, three breakfasts, three dinners, and trail passes for all four days. Coach fare is \$150 for members.

They offer guided snowshoe hikes with spectacular views of the Laurentians. Skiers can explore over 50 km of groomed trails in the Park Regional Val-David Val-Morin, or discover the P'tit Train du Nord linear park, groomed for classic and skate skiing from Val David to St. Jerome (40 km).
