The purpose of the meeting is to learn about the change in BTC leadership, what has changed, why it is changing, and how this fits into the BTC plans and directions going forward.

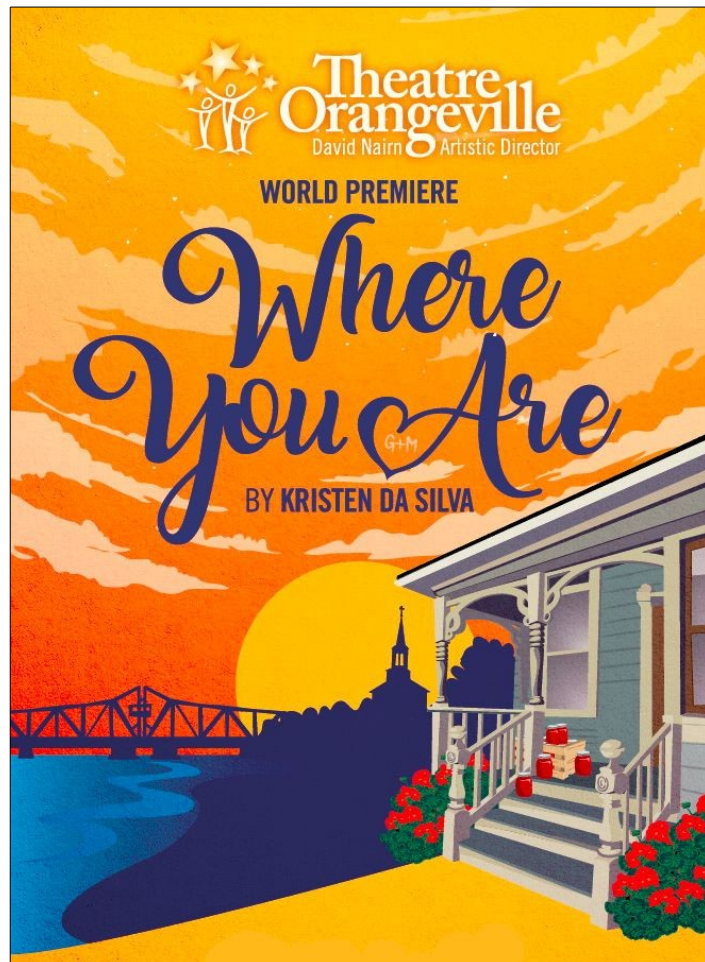

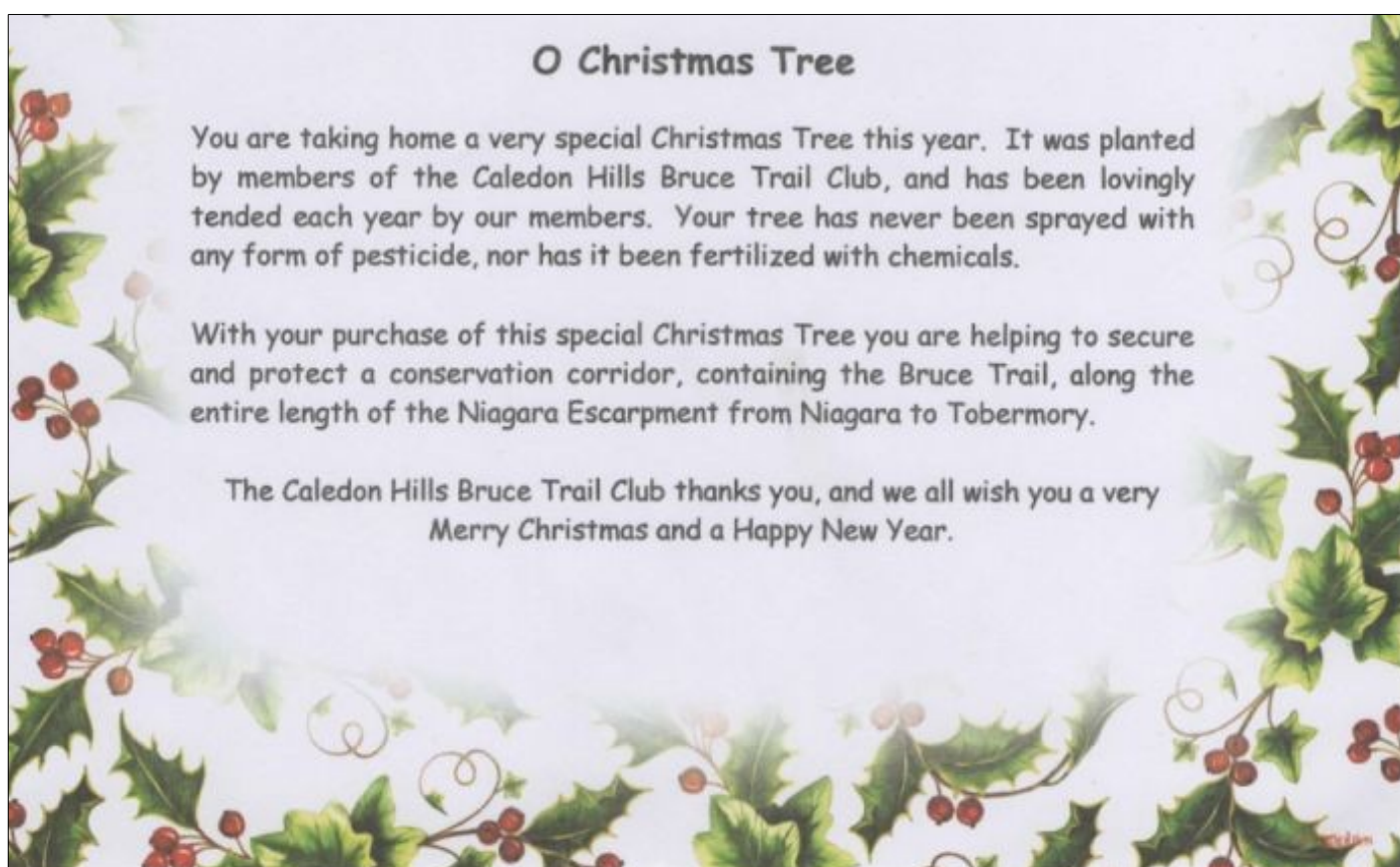
