Credit Valley Trail Takes Shape with First Sign Unveiling

Upper Credit Conservation Area, Alton



The Credit Valley Trail (CVT) gained its first stake in the ground on Tuesday, November 3, as project partners officially unveiled the trail's first wayfinding signage at Upper Credit Conservation Area in Alton. The Credit Valley Conservation Foundation (CVCF) also announced the launch of a major \$10 million fundraising campaign to help connect the full 100-kilometre trail.

"This is a milestone day for the Credit Valley Trail," said Karen Ras, Chair of the CVC and CVCF Boards and Councillor for the City of Mississauga. "Today's sign unveiling takes the bold vision of this legacy trail from strategy to reality."
